
#### **A LITTLE NIGHT MUSIC**

Two-thirds gripping thriller and one-third clever comedy of deceit and betrayal.




#### **INTO THE BREECHES!**

#### **NOISES OFF**

Sardines! Sardines! Called "the funniest farce ever written," NOISES OFF takes a fond look at the follies of theatre folk, whose susceptibility to out-of-control egos, memory loss, and passionate affairs turn every performance into a high-risk adventure. This play-within-a-play captures a touring theatre troupe's production of Nothing On in three stages: dress rehearsal, the opening performance, and a performance towards the end of a debilitating run. Frayne gives us a window into the inner workings of theatre behind-the-scenes, progressing from flubbed lines and missed cues in the dress rehearsal to mounting friction between cast members in the final performance.

A side-splitting backstage farce with slamming doors, falling trousers, and flying sardines!
